The library's planning process began in 2016 with two community focus groups: one with Johnston residents and one with Library staff. Attendees were asked to share aspirations they had for the Johnston community and how the Library might play a role in achieving them. With this input, the Library Board created a new mission statement and Library staff developed a number of practical objectives for the next several years.

We're excited about the direction this plan points us in—where we continue to improve existing collections and services while developing new initiatives that help us better serve a growing and changing community. We are not done listening. The plan will continue to evolve as we learn more about our patrons, about the Johnston community, and about the world at large in the coming years. MISSION:

Promoting discovery. Inspiring creativity. Engaging community.

STRATEGIC THEME #1

Promoting Discovery

We believe that a healthy community depends on broad and equitable access to information and help finding and understanding that information.

- The library will promote discovery by:
 - Helping patrons overcome economic, educational, and other barriers to information by providing access to technology and learning opportunities
 - Making staff expertise more accessible—particularly in the areas of early literacy, research, and reading
 - Ensuring library collections, services, and spaces support the diverse interests and needs of our community
 - Expanding and promoting outreach initiatives

Promoting Discovery: Objectives 2018-2020

Spaces

Establish a more family- or parent/child-friendly place to use a computer

Explore sound dampening for noisy areas

Create more "nooks" for quiet reading or studying

Public Awareness

Continue to grow awareness about the Johnston Public Library through the weekly e-newsletter, Facebook and instagram posts, and *Des Moines Register* and *Johnston Living* articles

Develop a web page for that includes examples of Youth Services activities–from weekly storytimes and other programs–that can be replicated at home

Offer JPL brochures and other staff-created informational materials in multiple languages

Explore creation and distribution of library "welcome packets" for people new to the U.S. or new to Johnston

Start a library Youtube channel

Offer JPL brochures and other staff-created informational materials in multiple languages

Content/Collections

Explore new ways of analyzing circulation and collections to ensure selections are meeting patron needs

Circulate pre-loaded tablets/e-readers for the technologically- or visually-impaired

Analyze the Youth Services collection to ensure it reflects an array of perspectives

Examine the Young Adult collections for materials better suited to the Juvenile collections

Develop blog posts, pathfinders, or other kinds of online content that directs patrons to resources on a particular topic

Work with the Johnston Historical Society to digitize local history content and make it available online

Start a "Hot Picks" collection of new materials where one copy of a popular title goes on display when available and cannot be held

Move the Reference Collection into the circulating collections

Review cataloging of older (still relevant and still circulating) materials to improve consistency of search results

Review standing orders with vendors to streamline ordering process

Refine metadata in bib records to improve filtering for audience, material type, and subjects

Build a collection of "rapid reads" titles for adults learning to read English

Technology

Explore online fine payment options

Add additional public PCs

Programs / Services

Offer notary services

Establish regular afterschool programming, particularly on early out days

Make videos of storytimes and other programs available online

Hold more children's programs outside the library—at local businesses, schools, and other organizations

STRATEGIC THEME #2

Inspiring Creativity

We believe that learning and creating are complementary and that individuals thrive when they have ways to express themselves.

- The library will inspire creativity by:
 - Collecting and promoting foundational and practical resources in the sciences and humanities
 - Providing access to creative tools and technology
 - Offering opportunities for personal instruction
 - Designing spaces and developing programs that encourage creative play

- The library will engage community by:
 - Seeking partnerships that benefit library patrons and the community at large
 - Expanding and promoting the library's local history collections

 - Providing opportunities for patrons to explore the history and culture of Johnston's minority communities

Spaces

Explore creating a space for older teens (ages 13-18)

Public Awareness

Increase knowledge about JPL volunteer program and communicate effectively to volunteers and staff

Content/Collections

Create a page on the library's website that contains information about community services, activities, and places

Create a community information kiosk that includes information about community services, activities, and places

Explore options for maintaining history of JPL in both digital and print formats

Programs / Services

Organize programs that showcase a particular country or culture

Explore programs or other activities that strengthen the library's relationships with underserved populations including immigrants and those that live adjacent to the library

Collaboration

Explore collaborations to offer free tax help at JPL

Explore collaborations to offer free homework help

Collaborate with EMBARC, Goodwill, United Way, and others to explore ways of serving immigrants and other minorities better
